



SUBJECT: Fatality Review Committee Decision on Chargeability

Decision: Not chargeable

In a unanimous decision, the Fatality Review Committee has determined that the death of [REDACTED] should not be charged to the mining industry. [REDACTED], a 51 year old equipment operator, was attending a weekly morning safety meeting when another employee fired on him and eight others. [REDACTED] and two other employees were killed. The assailant fled the mine property in his personal vehicle and later committed suicide.

A death certificate was not provided to MSHA, but the manner of death was determined to be homicide caused by a gunshot wound. The committee members concluded that his death should not be charged to the mining industry.
