



SUBJECT: Fatality Review Committee Decision on Chargeability

Decision: Not chargeable

In a unanimous decision, the Fatality Review Committee has determined that the death of ██████████ should not be charged to the mining industry. ██████████ a 28 year old trespasser, jumped from a catwalk 22 feet above the floor which connects the clarifier and mud press. He was found by mine employees before the early morning start-up of the plant. He had made a suicide threat earlier to relatives.

The death certificate and autopsy report indicated that the death was due to multiple blunt force trauma as a result of a fall. The death certificate indicated that the cause of death was suicide and that his fatal injuries were due to a fall from an elevated walkway.

Based on the findings of the death certificate, the autopsy report and the MSHA investigation, the committee members concluded that ██████████ was a trespasser on mine property and that his death should not be charged to the mining industry.
